Hi All,

As you are aware we have been looking into changing our sports teams. To enable equity amongst our teams we have split the students into three new teams with all students finding out last week what colour they are in. In addition we also wanted to change the names of our sports teams to reflect the significance of the area the school is located in. We have been waiting for permission to use Kaurna words to show the importance of the hills, creek and beach to the history of this area. I am excited to announce that this came through this week, our sports teams will now be called the following:

- Karnu meaning hill, this team will be green
- Pari meaning creek, this team will be blue
- Wauwa meaning beach, this team will be yellow

Each year students in year 1 undertake a phonics screening check that enables teachers to see how students are progressing in phonics. Phonics is vital in learning to read and is about children understanding the relationship between letters and sounds. The phonics screening check is a short, simple assessment that takes only 5–7 minutes and is carried out by classroom teachers with each student individually. Teachers then analyse the results and, if necessary, plan for any additional support that students might require. This year all Year 1 students in government schools will undertake the check in weeks 5-8 Term 3.

Finally, just a reminder that we are now taking enrolments for 2021. If you know of a family who will be enrolling their child in Reception in 2021, our transition program has started and is open to children turning 5 before 1st May 2021.



PHONICS SCREENING CHECK YEAR 1

Most children start school with some understanding of reading. Some can already read. Children who understand the relationship between letters and sounds—known as 'phonics'— will be at an advantage. Phonics is vital in learning to read. Some children struggle with learning to read. It is important that these children are quickly identified so that teachers can plan for any specific support they may need. When this is done early, children have the best possible chance in life and learning. The phonics screening check is a short, simple assessment that tells teachers how students are progressing in phonics. It takes only 5-7 minutes and is carried out by classroom teachers with each student individually. Teachers then analyse the results and, if necessary, plan for any additional support that students might require. All Year 1 students in government schools will undertake the check in weeks 5-8 Term 3. To ensure high quality and consistency, Year 1 teachers and leaders have been trained to use the phonics screening check during Term 2. The phonics screening check is one important element of the Government of South Australia's Literacy Guarantee, ensuring that all students have the best possible start in reading. The Literacy Guarantee is central to the improvement of literacy and numeracy for all students.
